Zoom Host, Jeanne : expects more than 100 people. Currently license is for up to 100. Next upgrade of license goes to 300 people. Additional \$55 for the year. Mike B: is there a one time fee? There is not, it is just an upgrade. Currently it is on the Pro account. We can lend out a meeting for groups in the district to create a meeting for them. Motion made and seconded for upgrade

Tom L: has reserved St Pius X for March 20<sup>th</sup> and has tried to reach Debbie. Wants to reserve the space for next year, as it helps the district raise money and educate people. Advises to get flyers out 6 months prior. Also include the Lynnwood Alano Club and Home groups.

Rita N, Archives: Created the flyer. Deb was going to confirm the date of the event. Kelly S mentioned that the 13<sup>th</sup> was chosen without approval from the District because it is the same date as our Pre-Conference. Rita said it is late to change the date, Kelly advised that dates should be given as options. Rita asked for Mike B to set up the next committee meeting, he will contact Jeanne and then Tausha will distribute.

Jeanne N: Regarding how to host a large meeting and security controls, will be meeting on that topic soon.

Terry: increasing the meetings should be able to retain the same meeting credentials without issues. Presented topic for discussion: enable chat function? Sometimes there is behavior that is inappropriate and with chat enabled, there is little controls. However, there is the joy of social interactions via the chat. Mike B: could someone message a host that would help with that issue.

Mike B: Event Coordinator position is fairly new, since this is new, we need to establish what we need to learn as a district. It was new to us, but it is awesome and we appreciate the work that was done.

It would be good to have a group of Co-Hosts in order to assist the event.

Kelly S: could also send flyers to Greater Seattle Intergroup and SnoKing intergroup.

New business:

Emails, Mike B: Area 72 will provide emails for the district. We would have the Area Web Chair to help us with lost passwords, and they would send out the new info every 2 years. Opened it up for discussion. Jeff K: Pro: it is not a gmail accounts, it would give us a domain. It would provide legitimacy to the emails that are sent. Con: what about associated contacts? And Jeff K could help with forwarding to a new email account. When passwords are reset, the emails stay intact. Mike B: suggests to keep the district ones and use this in addition to that as well.

John K: had this challenge during his term as Web Chair, and finds many of the gmail accounts are obsolete or unable to be accessed due to aged security information (like recovery phone numbers).

Voted and approved to go forward with the Area 72 emails, and the Chairs will decide if they give it to the Alt Chairs. Also Mike B will ask if every chair can have one, and we'll use all the emails as usual until we can smoothly accept the new accounts.





#### Service Manual Concept Article Series, Concept III

**Concept III**: To ensure effective leadership we should endow each element of A.A. – the Conference, the General Service Board and its service corporations, staffs, committees, and executives – with a traditional "Right of Decision."

This Concept is often misunderstood. Many times over the years I have heard that my home group has not given me the "Right of Decision." Or, I cannot vote on something if I don't have my home group's conscience. The misconception lies in the failure to recognize that when the group selects their General Service Representative, they have already given them the "Right of Decision." It comes with the trust that was handed to that person when selected to do the position. Remember that the General Service Representative is a "Trusted Servant" and should be given some trust to do what they believe is the best for A.A. as a whole, in the District, the Area or giving a consensus to the Delegate. Let's trust our Trusted Servants.

Let's take a look at the position of the "Coffee Maker." When selected by the conscience of the group, were they told that they could only buy a certain brand of coffee, or were they given some leeway? Suppose they needed to buy coffee for the group and today there was a sale on a different brand that would save the group twenty dollars for the month, so they decided to buy the sale brand; they thought maybe the group would find it wise, so they could use the twenty dollars to help carry the message. The group could buy a couple of Big Books, or something that would be of use to a newcomer. Would the group even know unless the "Coffee Maker" told them, which is the rest of this concept, the report back to the group? Would we tell that trusted servant that they did not have the right to make a change, or would we say "great job." I have never seen or heard of a group "Coffee Maker" being discharged for changing brands. But, I have heard groups tell them to please go back to what we have been using, we don't like change.

When I ask my wife to book travel plans without giving her parameters, is she free to try and make the best decisions? Absolutely, she has the freedom to look at the options and make the best choice for what she believes is the best situation. She had the "Right of Decision. "If she has questions prior to purchase she will ask. Or if she is reasonably sure she will make the reservations and give me the details afterwards. When my teenage grandchildren are old enough to get their driver's license, do they have to do so or do the have the "Right of Decision?" Concept Three, which works so well in Alcoholics Anonymous, also does a good job in the family. Thank God for giving Bill W. with such inspirational insight.
