Trish volunteered and qualified herself for Alt PI and was voted in.

Secretary: Tausha L. - Motion was made and seconded to approve the December minutes.

Treasurer: Traci W. – Getting up to speed, stated that the previous Treasurer, Claire sent the January Statement which was included in the newsletter. Had \$205 incoming in December. Small checks went out. You can see the budget for the whole year. Motion to approve the report by Ed, seconded and approved. Will be sending the donations for 2020 to the secretary to be included in the minutes. Total incoming: \$3,764.55, compared to last year: \$5,915.30 which is about 1/3 to 1/2 of what we did last year. Spending was down also. Budgeted last

year: \$6,384 to be spent on committees. We do not have enough coming in to cover the budget expenditures. \$5343 in 2018, \$3430 in 2017, which was a year we opted to donate as there was an overage. Service Manual Concept Article Series, Concept per Month

Concept II: The General Service Conference of A.A. has become, for nearly every practical purpose, the active voice and effective conscience of our whole society in its world affairs.

After the death of Dr. Bob, on November 16th, 1950, Bill followed through with the actions that the two of them put together as a plan of action for their demise. Doctor Bob was dying of cancer and they knew that eventually they would not be around to answer the questions that flooded the office on a daily basis. So, in that light they started laying out a plan for Alcoholics Anonymous to be structured enough to make their own decisions.

This structure was set up so that we would have representatives speak for us, i.e. General Service Representatives, District Committee Members and Delegates. We as home groups were to select the person that we thought would best carry out the delineation of pertinent matters on how best to carry the message to the still suffering alcoholic. We sometimes rush at making these choices and then scratch our heads and wonder if we picked the right person. Sometimes we just want to get the business over with and go home. This is not always the best way to do A.A. business.

Our General Service Representative, as well as the District Committee Member and Delegate get the opportunity to gather lots of information and try to disseminate to us the most proficient way they can. That is a lot of responsibility and not every individual is ready to take on that task. Try to take the time to choose correctly.

At home sometimes we cannot always be at an important meeting with bankers, brokers, doctors and our decisions and thoughts have to carried out, that is when we decide who is the most available for the timing and situation. Working these principles in our family makes a lot of sense. Trying to actually do this is not always the easiest thing to do. When I worked the steps and came to Step Twelve and it said "Practice these Principles in all of my affairs." It did not mean just the steps; it also meant the Twelve Traditions and the Twelve Concepts for World Service.

Over the years I have heard that the Twelve Concepts for World Service don't have anything to do with us they are just for the Conference. That statement is a pet peeve of mine. We, each member of Alcoholics Anonymous, are members of the World Service. Without us selecting delegates, through the process that has been laid out for us, all decisions would be made by the Trustees and Directors. We would not have anything to do with the future of A.A.

Wouldn't it be sad to wake up tomorrow and find out that there was no more A.A.? What would we do? Some of us might try to recreate what we have now. But, could we or would our ego's get in the way, or would we wait for someone else to take action because we are too busy. And, we do not want anything to do with those politics. "The drunk stumbling around in the dark just a block from here and the child being born today destined for our program," has no place to go for help. What then?

Pandemic 2020: Challenge and Response – An Archives Project


Western Washington Area 72 Pandemic 2020: Challenge and Response An Archives Project
