Dear Trusted Servants,

It saddens me to inform you that the Mountlake Terrace Sunday Group of Alcoholics Anonymous, a group that was founded in 1971 with so many memorable AA members as attendees and home group members has gone dark. I don't know if you received notification of this prior to now, but I know it should be done.

Quite a few years ago I was entrusted to be the Treasurer of this group, and did so for quite a few years. My attendance at this meeting dropped off, and I relinquished my duties as Treasurer, but the checking account that we used was never officially transferred over to the new Treasurer. Frankly, I have just ignored this situation for years and the account has sat dormant.

This has weighed heavily on my mind and my heart for a very long time. Now that the group has disbanded I know something must be done with the money that has just been sitting in the account for the last few years. So I am making a financial amends to Alcoholics Anonymous for me burying my head in the sand these last few years. I hope you will accept my amends in the spirit it is intended.

# **Committee Reports:**

I attended the **Corrections Quarterly** and collected some books and a few Pierce County schedules. I distributed some Big Books and Daily Reflections to the Everett jail, and some Big Books to the prison at Monroe, Minimum Security Unit. I hope to get more diverse schedules at the next quarterly in March, which will be closer in Everett, and hosted by District 19. It appears that the area Corrections Committee has a lot of literature available for prisoners, due in part to the Pink Cans in various meetings. They also have over \$2,000 for literature in case they need it. I can also ask the Eastside Intergroup for literature for the prison. I collected some info on how to set up more pink cans, but I feel that it's not needed at this time. Literature money can only be spent on literature, and we have more than we need, at least for now.

I'm looking forward to some good changes this year. Two more volunteers are going through orientation for MSU this month and will start attending in February. We also have two more returning, so life is about to get simpler for me, and more diverse for the inmates. I attend the Everett jail's women's meeting every Tuesday, and it's the only meeting they get during the week. We have four volunteers, so don't need any more until we can get more meetings going. The Work Release program there has been replaced with a support program for inmates who have no safe place to return to after incarceration. I am hoping for more financial support for the jails, so that perhaps we can have more AA opportunities at some time in the future.
