District Chair Reports:

Secretary – Katie S – Motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the October Meeting Minutes (page 6 of Newsletter).

Treasurer – Glen C. – Shared that the District bank account got hacked. The thieves made withdrawals totaling \$850 over a 2 day period. Was concerned that he didn't receive any alerts of suspicious activity from BECU during the 2 days. In the meantime, he set up new account numbers, debit cards and online login. Lisa confirmed she received her replacement debit card. BECU has the IP address of the hacker, but he hasn't received confirmation that the money will be restored. Motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report (page 7 of Newsletter).

Archives – Joyce B – Highlighted that the Plain Language Big Book is coming out. They will be on sale for \$11 at Greater Seattle Intergroup and will be available in early December.

CPC – Debbie B. – Was in contact with Carlos in Area. Postponing CPC Quarterly until May so District 24 can get its feet on the ground after the theft. We will need to contact church to let them know it's being rescheduled.

Detox – Kevin – Have full roster of people, but always in need of alternates.

Event Coordinator – Claire W – Updated both binders, will be ready to hand them over to Rachel in December. Need to know if there are any special arrangements to hand over the Events Coordinator email account. Rachel: Was able to reserve St. Pious for Gratitude Banquet on March 8th. Lisa clarified that Kelly set the email accounts up, and there are no special requirements for handing it over to Rachel.

Greater Seattle Intergroup Rep – Greg S – Reported that GSIG made \$115 in September. The Jamboree was nice. He was particularly moved by the 2^{nd} performance, a 92-year-old man named Pete. There were 4 12^{th} step calls and 194 points of contact total. Shared that the chat feature was down half the month, which likely led to lower traffic.

PI - Jeff K – Shared that there is a Quarterly happening next weekend and offered to attend with the incoming PI chair. Also shared that the PI Committee is looking for a host for the February Quarterly.

Newsletter – Sam (incoming chair) – Nominated Eric as Alt Newsletter Chair. Nomination was seconded and approved by members.

Young People's – Glen on behalf of Desi: Held Quarterly on 10/27 at LAC, had 20-30 people who attended online.

DCM – Lisa J – She will be reaching out to chairs in the coming month to review the description of their position in the District Handbook. Shared that December 1st is the deadline to send in service resumes for Area 72 appointed Service Positions. Highlighted that the new 2025 Literature Catalog is now available. Brought up a few follow up items from Assembly. First, the Area Newsletter discussion will be moved to the January Quarterly. There will also be a floor discussion about purchasing Metro bus ads for the holiday season. Encouraged GSR's to attend January Quarterly (https://area72aa.org/event/jan25quarterly/). Highlighted that PRAASA is coming up (https://area72aa.org/series/praasapacific-region-aa-service-assembly/). Lastly, shared that a couple years ago, AAWS made an inventory. She brought a copy of it to the meeting if anyone was interested in reading it. Thought it was important to know that even World Service is doing the work.



A Tool for Reading Alcoholics Anonymous

The Plain Language Big Book is a tool to help readers understand the book Alcoholics Anonymous, which was first published in 1939. This new book is designed so that the A.A. Twelve Step program of recovery from alcoholism may be easily understood and accessible by all people who have a desire to stop drinking.

Members of A.A. fondly call the original book Alcoholics Anonymous 'the Big Book.'' It is the basic text of the A.A. program. The Plan Language Big Book has been written to present the original ideas and same spiritual message of the Big Book, Alcoholics Anonymous.

This new text is not intended to replace the much beloved Big This new text is not intended to replace the much belowed Big Book. Rather, the *Plain Language Big Book* is a book crathed over several years by A.A. members and publishing professionals to support alcoholics on the path to recovery. The book is intended to help people who have a problem with alcohol gain access to A.A.'s lifesaving message.

For years, A.A. members have expressed a need for a Plain For years, A.A. members have expressed a need for a Plain Language Big Book. Based on the shared experience of A.A. members, some people may not have regular contact with other A.A. members to help them understand the A.A. program of recovery and the specific vocabulary as it is used throughout the original book Alcoholies Anonymous. Other people have a hard time reading, especially books that were written long ago. This Plain Language Big Book is written in simpler language to support readers in their recovery.

This book is published in accordance with Advisory Actions passed by substantial unanimity of the General Service Conference (GSC) of Alcoholics Anonymous. In 2021, the 71st GSC advised that this book be developed. Progress reports, then sample chapters were reviewed at the 72nd and 73rd GSCa. The final dark of the Plain Language Big Book was reviewed and approved by substantial unanimity at the 74th GSC, in April 2024. The Plain Language Big Book covers the core content of what is the "abridged version" (the edition without personal stories) of the original Big Book.
